About the European Students' Union (ESU)

- Founded in 1982, ESU is now the umbrella organisation of 45 National Unions of Students (NUS) from 40 different countries. Through its members, ESU represents almost 20 million students in Europe
- Our mission is to represent, defend and strengthen students' educational, democratic and political and social rights. ESU will work for sustainable, accessible and high quality higher education in Europe.
- Our members are student-run, autonomous, representative and operate according to democratic principles. They are open to all students in their respective country regardless of political persuasion, religion, ethnic or cultural origin, sexual orientation or social standing.

What makes ESU?

Legislative Body: Board Meeting (BM)

- The highest decision making body in ESU.
- Each country has 2 votes which are held by the respective national union(s) of students.

Executive Body: Executive Committee (EC)

- The Executive Committee is responsible for the execution of the decisions of the Board Meeting and its political affairs.
- Elected by the Board Meeting for the term of one year, re-elections are possible.

Secretariat

• Employed personnel in Brussels such as Head of Secretariat, Financial Officer, a Project Manager and Officers, Communications Officer and Executive Assistant. Work alongside 3 full time presidency members.



ESU's main working areas

- Social Dimension: Access and student support services
- Public Responsibility, Funding and Governance: Academic freedom,
 Student Participation, Sustainability and Community Engagement
- Quality and transparency: innovative structural reforms, Quality Assurance, Student Centred-Learning (digital transition)
- Mobility and internationalisation: European and Global engagement


